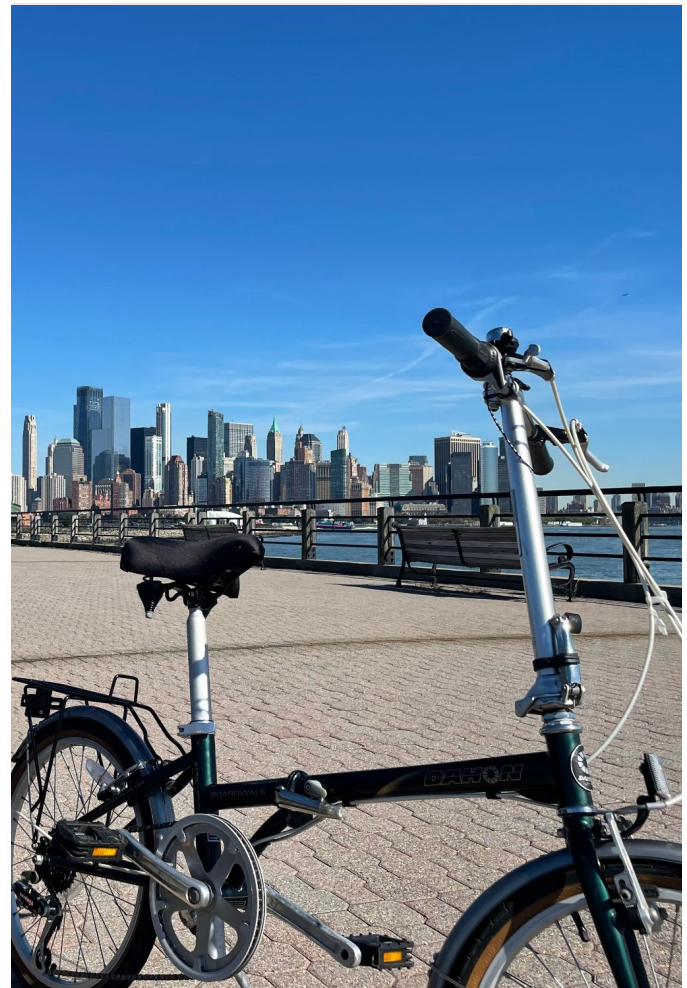

Plugins are the biggest source of WordPress security vulnerabilities.

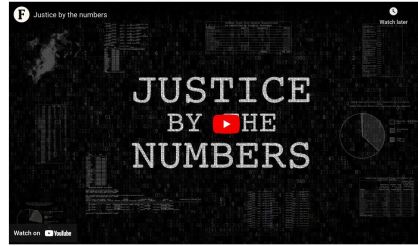
52% of 4,000 known vulnerabilities are from WordPress plugins according to a WPScan Report, compared to 37% from core WordPress and 11% from themes.

What happens when a public interest technologist joins with an organization like the ACLU of Massachusetts to achieve the largest dismissal of wrongful convictions in U.S. history?

In 2012, Annie Dookhan, a Massachusetts state chemist, was arrested for forging lab documents while testing drugs. During her tenure, more than 100 people were convicted and sentenced for drug crimes based on false evidence. The burden was put on the individuals affected, rather than the state, for the errors that occurred based on faulty evidence.

That is, until the Open Web Fellowship paired lawyers from the ACLU of Massachusetts with public interest technologist Paola Villarreal.

The fellowship is a collaboration between the Ford Foundation and the ACLU of Massachusetts to support the best emerging technology talent with civil society organizations that are desperately needed as a technologist, because although the court eventually dismissed the cases, they did have a victory: The number of cases that Dookhan had been involved in.

Data poured in from throughout the state, from different departments. In total, more than 24,000 cases that could potentially be dismissed were identified. A systems programmer from Mexico City, Villarreal worked with the ACLU to build a tool that could identify cases that were dismissed.

Accessible Websites

When designing a website, it's crucial to consider all users, including those with disabilities. Accessible websites require coding best practices, with usable user interfaces and intentional content.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

“ADA protects people with disabilities from discrimination. Congress intended for the ADA to keep pace with the rapidly changing technology of our times. Since 1996, the Department of Justice has consistently taken the position that the ADA applies to web content.”

— More Than Not Getting Sued

Accessibility is about usability for everyone.

Web Accessibility Standards



Content

All website parts + code

Web content needs to include text alternatives for images

User Agents

Browsers, players + assistive technology

This information needs to be processed by web browsers and then conveyed to assistive technologies, such as screen readers.

Software

| Services - used to produce web content

To create such text alternatives, authors need authoring tools that support them to do so.

— Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)

A technical standard for developers to account for perceivable information, operable interfaces, understandable content and robust compatibility – within the web tools they author.

— Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)

A

Minimal Guidelines

Level A has minimal guidelines and will likely not make your site compliant to the current standards.

AA

Common Compliance

Many organizations aim to meet this level to ensure their website is accessible to everyone.

AAA

Extensive Requirements

Likely to restrict interactivity. Pursued within a particular industry sector or with a distinct disability in mind.

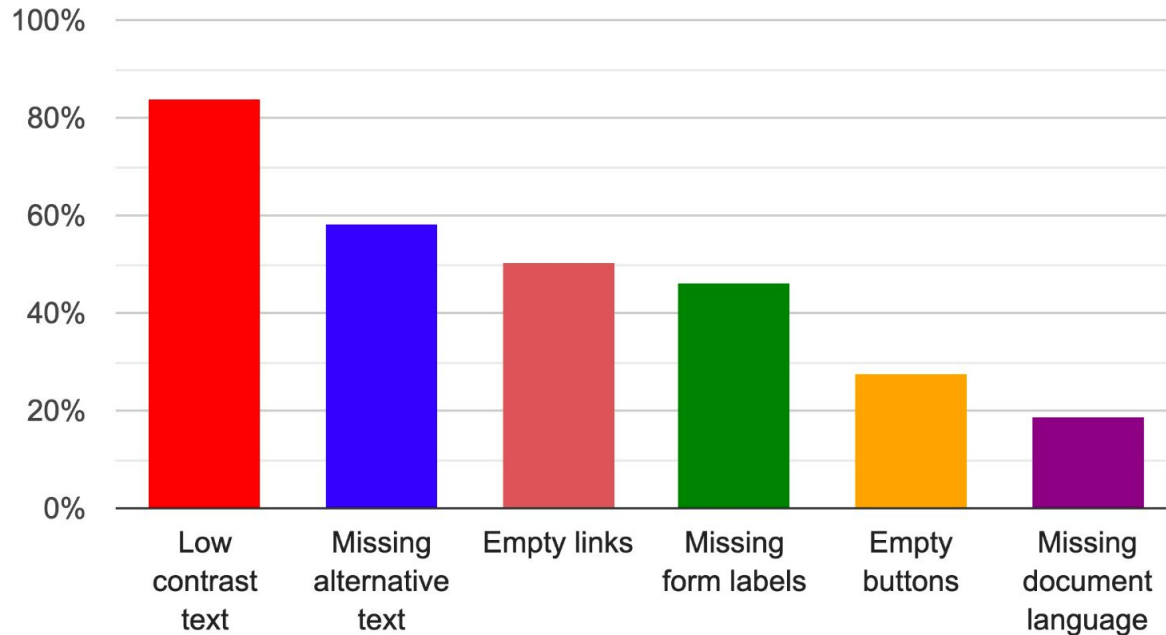
— Accessibility Principles

1. **Text alternatives** for non-text content
2. Captions and other **alternatives for multimedia**
3. Content **can be adapted to be presented** in different ways
4. **Content is easier** to see and hear
5. Users have enough **time to read and use** the content
6. Content **does not cause seizures** and physical reactions

— Accessibility Principles

7. Users can **easily navigate**, find content, and determine where they are
8. Users can use different input **modalities beyond keyboard**
9. Text is **readable and understandable**
10. Content appears and operates in **predictable** ways
11. **Users are helped** to avoid and correct mistakes
12. Content is **compatible** with current and future user tools

- 96.1% of all errors detected fall into these six categories.
- These most common errors have been the same for the last 5 years.
- Addressing just these few types of issues would significantly improve accessibility across the web.



Accessible Video

- Captions, descriptions, transcript
- Require intentional workflows
- Accessible media players
- Sign language(s) for AAA

Variable requirements:

- Pre-recorded or live
- Video with audio or video-only

Audio description of visual information is required for pre-recorded videos if there is important visual information.
WCAG - Level AA

Read aloud within the video for blind users to understand visual information

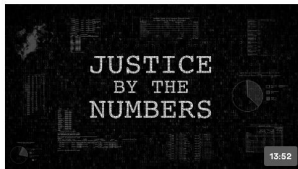

Plugin Overview

A Gutenberg block for video content to be accessible for visually impaired users by providing a button to switch from standard videos, to videos that provide audio descriptions of visual elements.

General Requirements and Primary Use Case

- Toggle between two videos
- Display scrollable text transcript
- Offer transcript file download
- Display a video accessibility policy

Functionality Highlights

- Screen reader skip link
- Adds metadata from YouTube and Vimeo APIs
- Settings page for global block settings
- Defaults to button styles from theme

Video Switcher

Potential Use Cases

Two versions or edits of the same video; Final video and “behind the scenes,” or “before and after” content. Position *TopChef* and *Last Chance Kitchen*.

Important Considerations

- Not compatible with classic editors
- This is not a media player

Approaching Development for Community Release

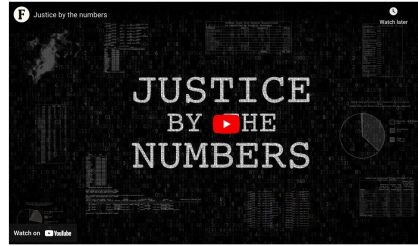
Website Launch Client Release

Launch ready functionality is *not necessarily* a release ready plugin. Remember, the goal of releasing an open source plugin is not just to share your code with the community, but also to encourage collaboration and improvement.

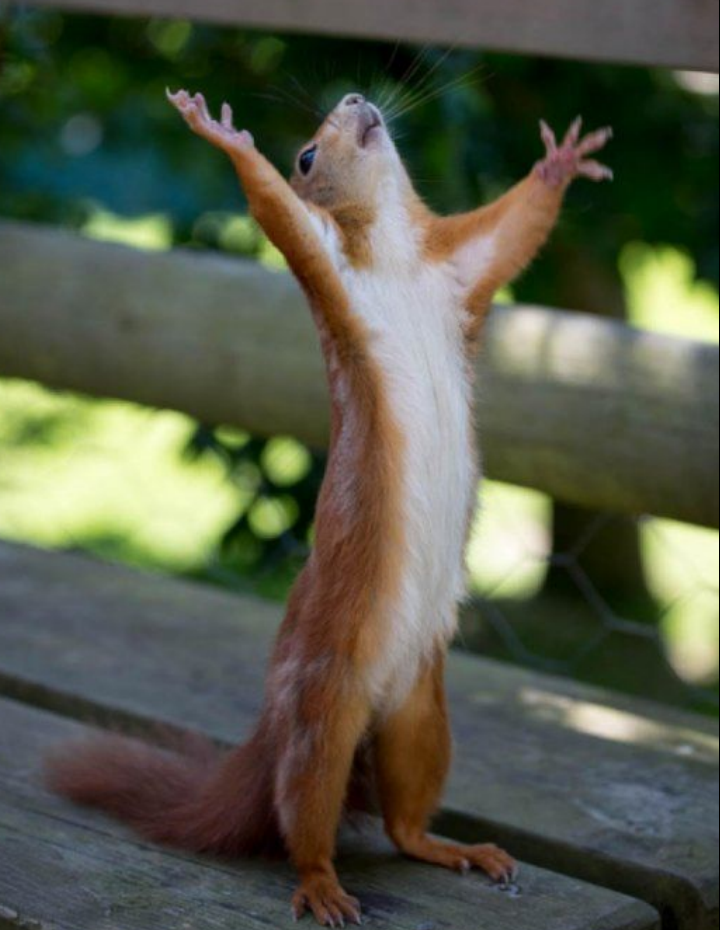
